Founded in 1984, the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs of GFW, a member of the General Federation of Women's Clubs, provides opportunities for education, leadership training and community service through participation in local clubs, enabling members to make a difference in the lives of others, one project at a time. There are approximately 6,000 members in 164 general clubs.

Too frequently, women's clubs' members are described as privileged, white-gloved women with too much time on their hands. Just the opposite is true. We look back with pride at the many accomplishments of our clubs and their members and know that activism is just as alive and spirited today.

In 1918, the NJSFWC founded the New Jersey College for Women (now Douglas residential College) and through our scholarships to Douglas students, the Federation continues to support this institution with its strong tradition of training tomorrow's women leaders.
